 - what if it doesn't snow (impact on the business)
- so successful that you built more plants
 - from Roseau to Osceola and Spirit Lake
- new engine options
 - Robyn Manufacturing in Hudson
 - Polaris Osceola

Hall Wendel, Jr. (30 sec)
addresses metamorphosis of corporate status

- formation of the MLP in 1987
 - how this benefitted shareholders
- New York Stock Exchange status

Hall Wendel, Jr. (30 sec)
concludes with an outlook for the future

- achieved 30% growth/year for the past 5 years
- Can this type of growth continue?
- American-made product competing against strong foreign companies
- Plans for the future
